#### Welcome and Introductions

- Lisa Frank taking over from Kisney Casey at City of Pittsburgh
- Tyler Hacker (Cornwell Engineering Group) joining today

#### **Active SDWMR:**

- Fifth and Forbes Water Main Replacement finishing in May 2022
  - o 2 miles of water main, 200 public lead service lines.
  - Very little lead found 14% public, 12% private



#### • 2021 SDWMR

- Two contracts awarded in January, PENNVEST closing next week, construction to start in midlate-March
- o 8 miles of water main, 900 public service lines + any private lead.
- Will take 1+ years to complete.
- 84% agreements returned highest rate of return before construction starts yet.

## **2022 SDWMR**

- Plan to apply to PENNVEST in May
- Project contingent on PENNVEST funding
- 3 contracts 12 miles of water main, 1,800 public service lines.

## 2023 - 2026 SDWMR

- Plan for 63 miles of water main replacement
- First 11 miles have been identified within priority lead neighborhoods
- We pull areas out of priority lead neighborhoods where we intend to replace water main and save them for later as to not dig up the street twice in close succession.

#### Other

- Thomas and McPherson Stormwater Project
  - o Replace portion of water main on McPherson
  - o 73 public service line replacements 54% lead on public and private
  - o 59% verified to-date
- Centre Avenue Sewer Project
  - o Replacing portion of water main on Centre Avenue
  - 14 public service lines
  - Construction to start in April
- Urgent LSLR
  - Will address leaking, old water mains.



## **Opt-Out Status**

- 15 opt-outs currently, all stated that the private side is not lead.
- If lead is found after inspection, we re-engage the customer to get them to opt-in.
- It is rare that the material matches what the customer says.
- 2 PWSA opt-outs, both vacants.
- For condemned properties, PWSA abandons service line.
- For vacants, PWSA replaces public and leave service terminated.

Pete DeMarco – Will there be a formal update to the materials inventory after the 2026 SDWMR is complete?

- We update inventory monthly on our website.
- Once we complete planning for the 2023-2026 SDWMR we will make an update to our 2026 LSLR plan for internal CIP planning.
- Our CIP has LSLR programs from 2024 2026, which was based on our plans. When we finalize the SDWMR we want to revisit those estimates.

Pete DeMarco – do you have estimate of when that will be?

• Later this year after planning 2023 – 2026. Not the highest priority in department but we'll continue to work on it.

Pete DeMarco – 63 miles will be ramp-up compared to past years. Is all that work contingent on funding, labor. i.e – do you think you can accomplish it?

- Contingent on funding, no matter the source.
- Not evenly spread over years based on our past work, we feel we can meet productivity goals.
- We may run into issues with hiring contractors for LSLR and SDWMR at the same time

#### 2022 LSLR Construction

- 2022 Priority LSLR PENNVEST funded
  - PENNVEST approved \$4.7M funding package for one-off LSLRs at daycare facilities and locations with elevated lead level.
  - Construction to start in mid-March
  - 170 agreements send in early-February consisting of all day care facilities on our list and all sample locations that have exceeded 15 ppb since August 2019, believe we can complete work at 400 locations
  - 42% return rate, which is great with relatively little outreach.
  - If we run out of locations, we will drop lead test level to 10 ppb, from 15 ppb, to include more locations.
  - PENNVEST closing March 14.
  - o Canvassing and phone calls continue for outstanding agreements.
  - Work to be completed by the end of 2022

Michelle-Naccarati Chapkis: Are you having daycare facilities take test before their replacement to confirm lead?

• No, we only removed locations based on evidence that they do not have a lead line (part of large building, service line over 2"). We removed those and sent agreements to the rest.

Michelle-Naccarati Chapkis: Concerned about premise plumbing that is left behind.

- Dan mentioned release form that was shared with WFHE team, Michelle confirmed she had some edits and will get it back to us.
- 2022 Neighborhood LSLR City ARP funds
  - Funding from American Recovery Plan \$17.5M
  - Contract awarded in January, late March construction start.
  - Fund allows for work at approximately 1,400 locations, replace 725 public lead lines.
  - Construction bids look good, hopefully can do more than 725.
  - Areas selected using our Prioritization Model, and then ranking Level 5 neighborhoods using affordability matrix + EPA Environmental Justice areas.
  - First mailing batch is approximately 500 areas sent last week.
  - o Elliott/Crafton Heights will go first since we have a sewer rehab project starting in June.
  - o Program will replace private lead if found this is different from past Standard LSLR contracts.

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- Unsure of return rate yet.
- o Will send more agreements after 2023 -2026 SDWMR planning is done.
- Work will be complete in fall of 2023.

Michelle-Naccarati Chapkis – Thanked City administration for funding. Other communities have received similar funding, are having a hard time kicking off. Michelle has suggested reaching out to us – has anyone done this?

- No, we have not received recent meeting requests.
- 2022 Urgent LSLR
  - o Renewal of current contract.
  - Will replace private lead when encountered during PWSA Operations work related to emergency public service line replacement (i.e. leaks).
  - Operations crews become overwhelmed by other repairs during busy cold months, our Urgent crews can step in.
  - Contract starts this week.

Michelle-Naccarati Chapkis – because many other agencies have received PENNVEST money, do you see concerns getting contractors?

- We bid these in December, got positive responses.
- Got really good pricing, even compared to 2019 contract bids.
- Larger concern is supply chain issues. Bigger issue for water main projects, which needs large lengths
  of pipe. Also seeing shortages of fittings.
- Not a lot of flexibility in materials buying while using state/federal funding must be US steel/materials.

## **Overall LSLR Progress**

- Replaced over 600 public, 500 private LSLR in 2021
- Verified 862 lines as non-lead.
- Due to winter conditions work is slow in 2022 thus far.

## **Termination Updates**

8 locations since April 2021



- All locations were vacant/unoccupied.
- o 2 were emergency operations replacements.
- o 5 were part of BRT project all unoccupied.
- o 1 part of 2020 SDWMR, PWSA opt-out for safety concerns.
- 272 37-Day letters sent. 87 30-day postings for tenants.
- Nine 3-day postings

Pete DeMarco - Do you think the terminations are motivating people?

- Seems like it is helping. Termination language is included in initial agreement package.
- Procedure will be used for LSLR sites, we used to just skip over unresponsive sites.

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## **Orthophosphate Update:**

- 2021b compliance sampling complete
  - o 136 samples received
  - o 90<sup>th</sup> percentile = 7.1 ppb
- Preparing Design Engineer's Report for DEP submittal to increase orthophosphate level.
  - Asking DEP to revert back to previous levels that were keeping ortho lower than recent results show.
- Continuing additional, on-going monitoring to ensure proper application of orthophosphate.

Michelle-Naccarati Chapkis – ortho usage was based on analysis. Are you saying that you want to switch to a different dosage?

- April 2019 late 2020 had ortho dosage at the same level. Studied the impacts of lowering pH+ortho to reduce lead. When we completed that, results weren't beneficial as we had hoped.
- Want to do additional pipe loop studies to test different dosages of orthophosphate.
- We've learned that corrosion control is not a "set-it-and-forget-it" process, you have to continuously monitor.
- We are harvesting lead pipes in our system to test scale inside pipes.
- Major effort that we'll never be done with.

## **Reimbursement Program Update:**



- Tenant or homeowner can qualify.
- 503 customers (vast majority) applied that are 300% of FPL or below.
- 52 locations have completed full process.
- We reach out to customers who have verified income but didn't continue the process.

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## **General Updates:**

- PUC settlement requirements status included in files
- Web map continues to be updated at the end of each month.
- Customer sampling plan continues will promote it in relation to Priority LSLR
- We now provide 2-year warranty for private LSLs (used to be 30 days)
- Now mail those with test result of 10 ppb or less a free pitcher and filter (used to mail a coupon for results between 10 and 15 and only mailed the pitcher and filters for a result over 15 ppb).

## **Funding Opportunities**

- Applying to PENNVEST funding in May 2022 for 2022 SDWMR contract
- Applying to EPA's recent "Reduction in Lead Exposure Via Drinking Water" grant.
- Continuing to wait for guidance on Infrastructure Bill funding. PA's share is \$87M for LSLR.

#### **LCR Revisions**

- LCRR finalized in December 2021
- Main topic in industry is inventory, required in October 2024
- PWSA presented to ASDWA symposium
- EPA asked PWSA to be a case study in their future inventory Guidance Document.
- Our next inventory submittal is due to PA DEP in December 2022 will look to PA DEP to determine if there will be revisions to our procedures.
